Dear Parent/Guardian, Your child,, has been found to have signs of head lice and is being excluded from school until treatment has been done. One day , is the allowed time frame for the student to be out for head lice
treatment.
What you need to know as a parent about head lice. Head lice are not a sign of bad hygiene or an unclean environment! Head lice affect all economic groups and children of all ages.
Head lice are not a reason for a child to be out for school for a long time. The American Academy of Pediatrics and the California School Nurse Association has done a large amount of research, and found that keeping kids out of school for head lice does not reduce the amount of cases of head lice in schools. Our current policy is that if a child is found to have live lice in their hair, they are sent home for treatment. They are allowed to return the next day. If a child has a large amount of nits (lice eggs), they will be sent home as well. The idea is that if there are a large amount of nits, live lice were missed on the head check. A child with a small amount of nits will be allowed to stay in school.
Please prevent the spread of a lice infestation by following the procedures below:
 Check everyone's hair in your household Wash hair with a special lice shampoo; this can be prescription or over-the-counter Treat all infested members of the household following the directions on the special shampoo Use the fine-toothed nit comb to remove nits and lice and prevent re-infestations Repeat treatment as directed, by the shampoo or physician's instructions to kill undetected hatched nits Vacuum all upholstered furniture, mattresses and carpets. Don't forget the car upholstery and car seats Wash bedding in hot water the same day hair is treated. Place items which cannot be laundered in a sealed plastic bag for two weeks
Children who are excluded will be readmitted only after treatment and after all live lice are removed. <u>Your child must</u> come to the health office for readmission. If live lice or a large amount of nits are detected, they will be sent home.
